#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- Be a current UConn undergraduate or graduate student who will be enrolled in the Fall 2016 semester at UConn.

- Completed Scholarship application (an incomplete application will not be considered)
- Copy of unofficial transcript
- Essay (500 words approximately)
- Resume
- One letter of recommendation
- References Form
- If selected as the award recipient, you will need to submit a brief follow-up statement and a photo in the fall semester
